Working with our partners from the community and voluntary sector, we are committed to building strong relationships with communities and residents to address the key issues and challenges the borough faces. The concept of our Community Hubs is to provide a 'one-stop shop' for residents to provide a local network of help and support.



Local graduates invited to find out about a career with the council

Residents and employees of the council who are graduates or due to graduate by July 2023 are being invited to apply for the National Management Trainee programme.

The council is offering residents and employees the opportunity to join its

graduate scheme to lead projects and services that make a real difference to the lives of our residents.

The National Graduate Development Programme (NGDP) is a two-year fast-track programme for graduates who want to make a difference while launching their management career in the public sector. It includes a fully funded postgraduate qualification in leadership and management and a starting salary of £28,470 per annum.

This is the third year we have been able to create a specific route for our residents and employees to benefit from the programme. We welcome applications from people who are passionate about making our borough a better place via our local route:

New Workforce Racial Equalities standard introduced across Adults and Children's service

The council has been selected as one of 18 local authorities in the UK to pilot the Workplace Racial Equalities Standards methodology, which ensures that employees from black and minority ethnic (BAME) backgrounds have equal access to career opportunities and receive fair treatment in the workplace.

The council's task was to look at workforce racial equality in Adults and Children's services against a set of nine nationally determined measures - including leadership representation and recruitment – before working with staff to codesign an action plan to improve performance against these metrics.

In January 2022, a group of frontline practitioners and managers from across Adults and Children's services took part in a series of workshops to review the data, share their lived experience and to suggest actions that will make a real difference to race equality in the council.

The workshops were designed to build on the ideas that had already been developed within Care & Support services throughout 2021, including the development of an anti-racism framework for social care.

The ideas that came out of these workshops were taken through a rigorous development process, involving directors along with experts in this area, to explore viability, feasibility, and connection to other areas of council work. This process led to the development of a detailed action plan focusing on activities and deliverables.

The term **Global Majority** is used throughout the action plan. This reflects feedback from the workshop participants, who preferred this term to BAME.

Parents urged to get their child's school to sign up to the School Uniform project

Did you know that 1.4 million wearable school uniforms end up in landfill every year in the UK?

We're encouraging parents and schools in the borough to work together to set up pre-loved school uniform shops, as part of a project to save families money and benefit the environment. The project, funded by East London Waste Authority (ELWA), is building a network of schools across Barking and Dagenham, Havering, Newham and Redbridge to set up pre-loved school uniform shops and stalls.

It will play an important role in supporting families through the cost-of-living crisis and creating a cleaner, greener place for people to live and work in.

Help and support available for residents through the Household Support Scheme

Residents who may be struggling with their finances or to make ends meet are being encouraged to get in touch.

Funding is available to vulnerable residents to support them with essentials over the coming months.

There are also a number of other support services including:

- Our Community Food Clubs which are free of charge and can provide £20 worth of food per week for a period of either three or six months at www.lbbd.gov.uk/community-food-clubs
- Our money and debt webpages provide an income and expenditure calculator and budgeting tools that will help people understand how much money they have coming in and how much is going out, helping them look at areas where they can make savings at www.lbbd.gov.uk/money-and-debt
- Residents who are worried about their finances and need help to tackle debt can now get advice and support from our local Barking and Dagenham Money website at: www.bdmoney.co.uk
- People struggling with increasing energy costs should contact their energy supplier about possible funds they may be entitled to, to help them through difficult periods. They can also access the Warm Homes Grant at www.gov.uk/the-warm-home-discount-scheme
- People with disabilities who aren't claiming specific disability benefits
 may be able to take advantage of a number of benefits available,
 including Personal Independence Payments, Disability Living Allowance
 (for children), and Universal Credit. For those caring for someone with
 disabilities they may be able to claim Carer's Allowance although this is
 means tested, at www.gov.uk/financial-help-disabled/disability-and-sickness-benefits
- People with a water meter who are experiencing financial difficulties may
 want to look into the Watersure scheme at
 www.ofwat.gov.uk/households/customer-assistance. Most water
 companies also have a fund to help those who are struggling, and it
 might be worth contacting their water provider.
- People who are out of work and looking to get into employment can get help and support from our Job Shops at www.lbbd.gov.uk/help-finding-work
- Anyone worried about a lack of skills can find courses and support on the Adult College website at https://adultcollege.lbbd.gov.uk/
