will also be able to gain a Level 1 Health and Safety in Construction qualification.

On successful completion of the course, participants will gain the green CSCS labourer card which will allow them to work safely in the construction industry. Staff at the BRIC will also assist participants in gaining other industry related construction cards.

- People struggling with increasing energy costs should contact their energy supplier about possible funds they may be entitled to, to help them through difficult periods. - People with disabilities who aren't claiming specific disability benefits

#### Low carbon fix for potholes successfully trialled in London

An innovative 'patching' machine that can fix potholes within two minutes with far less impact on the environment <u>has been successfully trialled in a London borough</u>.

During the trial, the London Borough of Redbridge used the Spray Injection Patching machine, made by road repair specialists Velocity, to achieve a record breaking 120 repairs in one day, and nearly 2,200 pothole repairs during the 12-week trial. Because the method has no excavation, waste, or heat involved, holes can be fixed with minimal carbon emissions and less impact on the environment.

London boroughs are pioneering green solutions that can make a real difference in their local communities. Each London borough has a local Climate Change Action Plan setting out how they will meet their climate targets and deliver a just transition for their communities and businesses.

They are working together via the <u>London Councils' Climate Programme</u> to establish a greener future for London and its residents. This work includes prioritising low carbon development, which seeks to increase low carbon buildings and infrastructure through borough planning powers.

Councils are currently facing huge challenges in maintaining London's roads, with a £1.59 billion highways maintenance backlog. However, boroughs are innovating to try to address this, while also reducing carbon emissions and safeguarding London's green future.

#### **Business 1000 launch**

The annual London Councils/London Chamber of Commerce survey of over 1,000 businesses is the most comprehensive review of what the capital's business leaders are thinking.

The survey includes businesses of all sizes from across London and includes a detailed look at their views on topics such as apprenticeships, recruitment

plans, crime and environmental sustainability, with results broken down by sub region, business size and sector.

This year's Business 1000 will be launched at an online event at 10.30am on Wednesday 6 December. You can book a place at the online launch here.

The event will be chaired by Mayor Jason Perry, elected Mayor of Croydon and London Councils Executive Lead Member for Business, Economy and Culture.

#### MPs hear evidence of financial distress in local authorities

London Councils Acting Chair Cllr Claire Holland was among those who gave evidence last Wednesday to the <u>Levelling Up</u>, <u>Housing and Communities</u> (<u>LHUC</u>) <u>select committee</u>, which is taking evidence on its inquiry into financial distress in local authorities.

The LHUC select committee inquiry is seeking to examine the current landscape of financial resilience in local authorities in England, what lessons can be learned from the recent issuers of section 114 notices, and how the various responsible bodies are fulfilling their responsibilities to ensure effective and sustainable local government.
